APPLICABILITY OF SECTIONS 34(1) AND 38(1) OF THE NATIONAL HERITAGE RESOURCES ACT, 1999 (ACT 25 OF 1999): UPGRADING OF EXISTING A. FEROX STORMWATER DRAINAGE SITUATED ON A PORTION OF ERF 7284 (DANA BAY), MOSSEL BAY DISTRICT AND MUNICIPALITY

- 1. Our previous communications in relation to the above proposed engineering upgrading works refer.
- 2. Based on the background information provided as part of the A. Ferox Dana Bay Stormwater Upgrade Report by V3 Consulting Engineers dated 22nd November 2021 (Ref. 10082001), it is evident that the proposed works do not trigger any of the development activities listed in terms of Sections 34(1) and 38(1) of the National Heritage Resources Act, 1999 (Act 25 of 1999) ("NHRA"):

- 3. The proposed works as outlined therefore does not trigger any "Permit" application (Section 34 of the NHRA) or a "Notice of Intent to Develop" application (Section 38 of the NHRA) to the competent authority (being Heritage Western Cape) in this case.
- 4. It is noted that the urban catchment area drained through this particular stormwater drainage comprise primarily of hardened surfaces, which invariably concentrates the volume and velocity of surface water run-off. By implication therefore said run-off has resulted in erosion, which drastically reduces the probability for encountering archaeological and/or palaeontological occurrences within the study area that may remain within an undisturbed (in situ) context.
